Don't swing the camera when carrying it by the wrist strap.


Using the Soft Case

OPERATING THE MULTI-CONTROLLER

The multi-controller is used to set shooting mode, to move cursor when the camera Menu is shown, and to confirm the selection.



Up Button

- · To enter Quick View mode.
- · To move the cursor up when MENU screen is shown.

Right Button

- · To set Flash mode in Shooting Mode.
- · To move the cursor to right when MENU screen is shown
- · To enter submenu.

Down Button

- · To set Continuous Shot in Shooting Mode.
- · To set Self-Timer in Shooting Mode and Video Mode.
- · To move the cursor down when MENU screen is shown.

Left Arrow

- · To set Macro shooting in Shooting Mode and Video Mode.
- · To move the cursor left when MENU screen is shown.

SET Button

- · To enter submenu.
- To confirm the setting.

PREPARING THE CAMERA

INSTALLING THE BATTERIES

Insert two (2) AA-size batteries (Alkaline or Ni-MH rechargeable).

- 1. Be sure that the camera power is off.
- Slide the Battery/Memory Card door in the direction of the arrow, and lift it open.




- Insert two AA batteries with the positive (+) and negative (-) poles matching the directions indicated inside the battery cover.
- 4. Close the Battery/Memory Card door.



Battery Status Indications

The battery power level indicator represents the level of power of the batteries. The meaning of each icon is as follows:






If POWER button is pressed for over 1 second but the camera still does not power on, the batteries may be drained. Replace the batteries with new ones and try again.

INSTALLING AN SD CARD

The digital camera is equipped with a 16 MB internal memory. If no SD card is inserted in the camera, all pictures/video clips recorded by the camera will be stored in the internal memory. When SD card is inserted in the camera, all pictures and video clips recorded by the camera will be stored on the SD card

- 1. Turn off the camera.
- Slide the Battery/Memory Card door in the direction of the arrow to open the door.
- 3. Insert the SD card as shown in the diagram.
- 4. Close the Battery/Memory Card door.



To remove the SD card

Gently press on the edge of the SD card, the card will eject up. Pull the card out and close the Battery/ Memory Card door.

FORMATTING INTERNAL OR SD CARD MEMORY

If you wish to delete all the images and video clips stored in the internal memory or memory card, or when you use a brand new memory card, please follow the steps below to format the internal memory or memory card:

- Insert the memory card if you want to format the memory card instead
 of the internal memory.
- 2. Turn on the camera.
- 3. Press the MENU button.
- 4. Press the 4 to select the Setup Menu.
- Press the
 □ or □ to select Yes or No.
- Press the SET button to confirm the selection.




- Formatting will erase all the data in the memory, including the protected files. Please check
 the contents in the memory before formatting the memory.
- 2. SD cards formatted in another camera, computer or peripheral device may not operate correctly. When that happens, reformat the SD card with this camera.



TURNING THE POWER ON / OFF

Press the **Power** button and hold it until the LCD indicator begins flashing green. It takes about 1 second to power on the camera.



To turn off the camera

Press the Power button to turn off the camera.




The camera might be powered off automatically after being idle for some time. The Auto-Off setting can be changed in Set-Up menu.

- 5. Press the and 4 to select a field to change.
- 6. Press the ♦ 🖳 and 🖾 to set the values.
- 7. Press the **SET** button to save the settings.
- 8 Press the (MENU) button to close the menu window





DATE STAMP

The camera provides a Date Stamp that can be turned on or off freely. If you want to have Date and Time shown on the pictures, set the Date Stamp to ON mode.

- 2. Press the MENU button.
- Press the ♡ □ or □ to select Date Stamp then press the SET or \$\\ \bullet\$ button to enter its submenu.
- 4. Press the 🖒 🖳 or 🗈 to select On or Off.
- 5. Press the **SET** button to save the setting.
- 6. Press the MENU button to close the menu window.





SETTING THE LANGUAGE

BASIC FUNCTIONS

SETTING THE LCD DISPLAY MODE

Press the DISP button to turn the LCD on or off.

The LCD display changes as indicated below when **DISP** button is pressed repeatedly:











USING THE ZOOM FEATURE

The camera has a 3x optical zoom lens with an effective zoom range 5.9 mm to 17.17 mm (equivalent to 35 mm to 103 mm in 35 mm film format) as well as 4x digital zoom capability.

Telephoto / Wide Angle

- 1. Press **T** to zoom in for a telephoto shot.
- 2. Press W to zoom out for a wide angle shot.



USING THE DIGITAL ZOOM

- 1. Turn the LCD on by pressing the DISP button.
- Press and hold the T button until the maximum optical is reached. The LCD will show "x1.0" zoom indicator.
- Release the T button and press it again to further zoom in the image digitally. The zoom indicator shows the current approximate zoom factor. The maximum digital zoom is "x4.0".
- 4. Press the W button to zoom out.



TAKING PICTURES

BASIC STILL IMAGE SHOOTING

Set the camera mode switch to



- Frame the subject with the LCD or viewfinder.
- 3. Press the T or W button to zoom in or zoom out the subject.
- 4. Press the Shutter button halfway down to activate the auto-focus until AF LED stops blinking and the white AF Frame turned into green.
 - The shutter speed and aperture values will appear on the LCD monitor.
- 5. Press the **Shutter** button fully down to capture the image.





- 1. If the Shaking Warning indicator (😤) is shown on the LCD, that means the shutter speed is slow, and you should place the camera on a tripod or a steady place before shooting in order to ensure the image quality.
 - 2. In the following conditions, the AF LED will continue to blink and the AF Frame will remain in red:
 - There are several subjects at different distances within the focus lock area. Recompose the picture by moving the camera slightly.
 - There is no color contrast. Recompose the picture with a subject that contains more color.
 - There is insufficient lighting. If possible, increase the lighting in the surrounding area.

REVIEWING THE FILE AFTER SHOOTING

The guick playback function is available in each shooting mode.

- 1. Press the 🔁 button, the last captured photo or video clip will be shown on the LCD. If it is video clip, press the SET button to replaying the video
- 2. If you are not satisfied with the picture or video, you can delete it directly by pressing the in button first, then press the in the interest of th



button to select YES, and then press SET to confirm.

3. Press the 🗈 button again to return to shooting mode.

SETTING THE IMAGE QUALITY AND RESOLUTION

You can change the image quality and resolution settings to suit the purpose of the image you are about to shoot.

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Press the Ŋ ☐ or ☐ button to select the settings you wish to set then press the SET button.
- 4. Press the (MENU) button to close the menu window.

- Press the \$\frac{4}{2}\$ button repeatedly to switch between flash modes. The selected flash mode icon will appear on the LCD monitor.
- 2. Shoot the image.



About the Red-eye Reduction Function

Shooting with flash in dark places, the subject's eyes may appear red in the picture. This phenomenon is known as "Red-Eye" and occurs when flash reflects back from the retina.

When shooting with the red-eye reduction function, the subjects must look right at the flash for this mode to be effective. Try asking them to look directly at the flash. Even better results can be obtained by shooting with the lens set to a wide angle, by increasing the lighting indoor settings, or by approaching closer to the subject.

SELECTING THE METERING MODE

The camera enables you to select the metering mode to suit the shooting conditions and purpose.

Multi-pattern metering:

The image is divided into multiple regions and metering is performed for each region. The camera judges the subject position and background brightness, and determines a well-balanced exposure.

Spot metering:

The camera meters the light within the AF frame.

- 1. Set the scene to "Auto" mode. (P. 24)
- 2. Press the MENU button.
- Press the ♡ □ or □ to select Metering then press the SET or \$\\ \bullet\$ button.



- 4. Press the ⊗ 🖳 or 🗁 to select the settings you wish to set then press the **SET** button.
- 5. Press the (MENU) button to close the menu window.



Light Metering menu will not be shown if "Sport", "Landscape", "Portrait" or " Night" scene is selected.

MACRO MODE

Use the macro mode to shoot close-up of subjects in the range of 10 cm to 50 cm (3.94 in. to 19.89 in.)

- 1. Press the DISP button to turn the LCD monitor on.
- 2. Set the scene to "Auto" mode. (P. 24)
- 3. Press the button. The icon appears on the LCD monitor.
- 4. Shoot the image.





- The focus range mentioned above is the distance between the camera lens surface and the subject.
- 2. Any flash setting can be used in macro mode.
- 3. Always use the LCD monitor to compose images in macro mode. Shooting with the optical viewfinder is possible, however, images composed with the optical viewfinder might be offcentered due to the parallax phenomenon.
- 4. When you do not intend to use Macro shooting anymore, remember to cancel Macro mode by pressing the * button.

TAKING PICTURES WITH SELF-TIMER

Use the self-timer to set a delay from the time the shutter button is pressed to the time the image is shot.

- Press the S

 □ button to until the Self-Timer icon (S) is shown on the LCD.
- 2. Shoot the image.
 - The self-timer lamp starts blinking after the shutter button is fully
 pressed down. The image will be shot in approximately 10 seconds.
 The self-timer will blink faster two seconds before the shutter
 activates.



TAKING CONTINUOUS PICTURES

- 1. Press the 🖒 🖳 button until the Continuous Shooting icon (🖳) is shown on the LCD.
- Shoot the image. The camera will capture 3 continuous pictures in 1600x1200 or 640x480 resolution



If the resolution is set at 2592 x 1944 or 2304x1728, when continuous shooting is selected, the resolution will be changed to 1600x1200 automatically.

To deactivate the Continuous Shooting, press 🖔 🖳 until the continuous icon disappears.

SHOOTING IN LONG SHUTTER MODE

You can set the shutter speed to a slow setting to make dark subjects appear brighter.

- 1. Set scene at "Auto" or "Night" mode. (p.24)
- 2. Press the (MENU) button.
- Press the
 □ or
 to select Long Shutter then press the SET or
 button.
- Press the S 및 or ⑤ to select the setting you wish to set then press the SET button.
- 5. Press the (MENU) button to close the menu window.





When long Shutter speed is selected, shake of the camera will decrease picture quality. If the camera shake warning appears on the LCD monitor, secure the camera to a tripod before shooting.

Available Shutter Speeds

The following shutter speeds are available: 1 sec, 2 sec, 4 sec, 8 sec

ADJUSTING THE EXPOSURE --- EV ADJUSTMENT

Adjust the exposure compensation setting to compensate for certain light conditions including: backlighting, indirect indoor lighting, and dark backgrounds.

- Press the button and set scene at "Auto" or "Portrait" mode (p.24).
- Press the S □ or □ to select Exposure then press the SET or 4 button.
- Press the notation of the exposure compensation value. Available settings are: -2.0, -1.7, -1.3, -1.0, -0.7, -0.3, 0.0, +0.3, +0.7, +1.0, +1.3, +1.7, +2.0 then press the SET button.



4. Shoot the image.



ADJUSTING COLOR TONES --- SETTING THE WHITE BALANCE

When the white balance mode is set to match the light source, the camera reproduces colors more accurately.

- 1. Set scene at "Auto" or "Portrait" mode (p.24).
- 2. Press the (MENU) button.
- 3. Press the S 및 or ⑤ to select White Balance then press the SET or \$\dagger\$ button.
- Press the or 4 to set the white balance value then press the SET button.





USING THE SCENE MODE

The camera provides 4 preset scenes for you to get the best capture of specific scenes.

- 1. Press the (MENU) button.
- Press the Ŋ ☐ or ☐ to select Scene then press the SET or \$\\ \bullet\$ button.
- Press the Ŋ ☐ or ☐ to select the setting you wish to set then press the SET button.







Change of Scene setting will disable Macro mode.

USING THE PHOTO EFFECT

An image can be recorded in a different Photo Effect Mode.

Sepia	Records images in sepia tone.
Black & White	Records images in black & white.
Vivid	Emphasizes the contrast and color saturation to record in bold colors.

- 1. Set Scene to "Auto" mode.
- 2. Press the (MENU) button.
- 3. Press the ♥ □ or □ to select Effect then press the SET or 4 button.
- 4. Press the 🐧 📵 or 🗈 to select the setting you wish to set, then press the SET button.






TAKING VIDEO CLIPS

The digital camera can shoot video clips with audio.

- 1. Set the camera mode switch to Video Mode ().
 - · The LCD monitor displays the maximum recording time.
- Press the **shutter** button all the way down to start record movie clip.
- Press the shutter button again to stop recording.
 Otherwise the camera will keep recording until memory is full.





Be careful not to touch the microphone while shooting.




- 1. The video resolution is set to 320×240 pixels and cannot be changed.
- 2. White balance is set and locked to the settings of the first frame.
- 3. Self-Timer and Macro mode shooting can be activated in Video Mode. (p. 21)

REPLAYING PHOTO & VIDEO CLIPS

REPLAYING PICTURES/VIDEO CLIPS

You can view the recorded images and video clips on the LCD monitor.

- 1. Set the camera mode switch to .
 - The last recorded image or video clip appears on the LCD monitor



- Press the button to move to the previous file and press the button to move to the next file.
- When video clip icon is shown, press SET to start playing the video. Press SET again to pause or resume playing.



MAGNIFYING IMAGES

Images can be magnified up from 1 times to 8 times (1.1, 1.3, 1.6, 2.0, 3.0, 4.0, 6.0, 8.0).

- 1. In the Review \blacktriangleright mode, press **T** to magnify the image.
- Press the ♣, ♠, ♦ ♠ or ➡ to move the magnified area around the image.
- 3. Press W to zoom out to the original full-sized image.



VIEWING PICTURES OR VIDEO IN THUMBNAIL MODE

The Thumbnail mode allows you to view up to nine images at a time on the LCD monitor.

- In the Review mode, press the W button to view thumbnail images. The selected image is highlighted in red border.
 - · For video clips, only the first frame will be shown.
- 2. Press the 🐩 , 🐇 , 🖒 🖳 or 🛅 to select an image.
- Press the telephoto T or SET button to display the selected file in full screen size



ERASING FILES FROM MEMORY

Erase files that you don't want to keep to make more memory space available. You can erase individual files or all files when the camera is in playback mode.

Erasing files Individually

- 1. In the Review \blacktriangleright mode, press the \clubsuit or \clubsuit to find out the file to be deleted.
- Press 俗.
- 3. Press 🖒 🖳 or 🗂 to select YES or NO.
- Press SET to confirm the choice.

Note: Do not press SET repeatedly. Otherwise you may have other files deleted.

5. Press **MENU** to exit the submenu of Deleting One.



Please note that erased files cannot be recovered. Exercise caution before erasing a file.

Erasing All Unprotected Images


- 1. In the Review mode, press the menu button.
- 2. Press the 🖒 🖳 button to select Delete ALL and then press SET or 🕏 button.
- 3. Press the ♦ 🖳 or 🔁 to select All and then press SET or 🕏 button.
- 4. Press the 🖒 🖳 or 🗈 to select Yes or No, then press the SET button to confirm the choice.
- 5. Press the (MENU) button to close the menu window.



PROTECTING PHOTOS AND VIDEO CLIPS

You can protect important files from being accidentally erased.

- 1. In the Review mode, press the (MENU) button.
- 2. Press 🖒 🖳 to select **Protect** then press the **SET** or 🕻 button.
- 3. Press (s) or (5) to select Single or All and then press the SET or 4 button.
- 4. Press 🖒 🖳 or 🗀 to select **Yes** or **No**, then press the **SET** button to confirm the choice. The file(s) being protected will have a key shape icon shown on the upper left corner of the LCD.





To remove the file protection, follow steps above but choose "unprotect".

PLAYING A SLIDE SHOW (AUTO PLAY)

In slide show mode, all images can be displayed one-by-one in an automated slide show.

- 1. Set the camera to the Review mode.
- 2. Press (MENU) button.
- Press the S
 ☐ to select SLIDE SHOW then press the SET or button.
- 4. Press the ♦ 및 or ⋾ to select OFF, 5 sec or 10 sec and then press



The slide show begins automatically, starting from the current display image. For Video clips, only the first frame will be shown.

5. Press SET button to stop the slide show.

COPYING FLASH MEMORY IMAGES TO A MEMORY CARD

The camera allows you to copy all files that are stored in the camera's internal memory to an installed SD memory card.

- 1. Set the camera to the Review \blacktriangleright mode.
- 2. Press the (MENU) button.
- Press the
 □ or □ to select YES or NO, and then press SET to confirm.
- 5. Press the (MENU) button to close the menu window.

SETTING USB MODE

You can set USB mode to connect the camera with a printer or computer.



Images or video clips are assigned file numbers from 0001 to 9999, and folders are assigned folder numbers from 100 to 999



Folder File Capacity

Each folder usually contains up to 9999 images. If a photo is taken when the folder with highest folder number contains a picture file number equal to or greater than 9999, the camera creates a new folder by adding one to the current folder number. For example, if the current folder is "100DICAM" the new folder is named "101DICAM"

If the highest folder number is 999 and the highest file number exceeds 9999, the camera will display the warning message "Folder Can Not Be Created." In this case, please set the File Number Reset to ON mode and then format the memory or insert a new memory card.

FILE NUMBER RESET

Use File Number Reset if the camera experiences a ""FILE NUMBER OVER" error or if you want to restart numbering, for example, after erasing all files.

- Press the (MENU) button.
- 2. Press the 4 to select the Setup.
- Press the Ŋ ☐ or ☐ to select File NO. Reset then press the SET or button.
- Press the
 □ or □ to select On or Off and then press the SET button.





- Setting the File No. Reset to OFF is useful for avoiding file name duplication when images are downloaded to a computer.
- 2. If the File No. Reset is set at ON position, when the memory card is formatted, the folder number and the file number are initialized and the count starts from 100 and 0001. If the file Number Rest is set to OFF, when the memory card is formatted, the numbering starts with the last file and folder number stored in the camera.

SELECTING PICTURES FOR PRINTING

You can select pictures for printing and specify the number of printing copies. This is extremely convenient for sending pictures for printing by a photo developing service or on a direct print compatible printer.

Selecting Pictures for Printing

- 1. In Review \blacktriangleright mode, press \clubsuit or \clubsuit to select the picture to be printed.
- 2. Press (MENU) button.
- 3. Press the ♦ 🖫 or 🗈 to select Print Order.
- 4. Press **SET** or **4** to enter the **PRINT** setting menu.
- Press Ŋ 및 or ≦ to select Single or All then press the SET or 4 button. The setting printing order submenu appears.
- Press the S 및 or ☐ to set the number of copies (up to 999), then press 4 to confirm the setting.
- Press the Ŋ ☐ or ☐ to set date On or Off, then press SET button to confirm the setting.
- 8. Press the (MENU) button to close the menu window.





PRINTING PICTURES DIRECTLY

There are two ways to print the stored pictures without the help of computer:

Printing Pictures by Using SD Card

- 1. Transfer the stored pictures from internal memory to SD card. (If necessary) (p. 28)
- 2. Set the printing order (p. 30).
- 3. Insert the SD card into the SD card slot of the direct printing compatible printer.
- 4. Refer to the instruction manual of the printer to print the pictures.

Printing Pictures by Using a USB Cable

Depend on the type of printers, there are two ways to print pictures through USB connection:

Printer type I

- 1. Set the printing order (p. 30).
- 2. Connect the camera to the direct printing compatible printer via the supplied USB cable.
- 3. Power on the printer, and refer to the instruction manual of the printer to print the pictures.

Printer type II

- 1. Power on the direct-printing-compatible printer.
- 2. Power on the Camera and set the camera's USB mode to "Printer". (p.28)
- Connect the camera to the direct printing compatible printer via the supplied USB cable.
 The camera's LCD will show menu as below.
- Press the Ŋ ☐ or ☐ to select Image, then press SET to enter the setting menu.
- 5. Press the ♦ □ or □ to select Single or All then press the \$ button.



Press the Ŋ ☐ or ☐ to set the number of copies (up to 30), then press
 SET to confirm the setting.



7. Press the 🐧 🖳 or 🗈 to select **Print** then press the 🔏 button.



8. Press the 🐧 🖳 or 🗈 to select **Custom** then press the 🕻 button.




 Press the ♡ □ or □ to select Start then press the SET button. The images will be printed.





Note: Before proceeding to print, you can set paper size by pressing the ③ 및 or ⑤ to select Custom, then press ⋠ to enter custom submenu, and then select Size by pressing the ⑤ 및 or ⑤ again.

DOWNLOADING FILES TO A COMPUTER


Download files taken with the camera to a computer in one of the following ways:

- 1. Directly from the SD card reader.
- 2. Connect the camera to a computer with the USB cable.

Note for Win 98 SE users: You must install the camera driver bundled on the Software Installation CD-ROM before connecting the camera to the computer.

Downloading Directly from an SD Card

- Eject the SD card from the camera, and insert it into an SD card reader connected to the computer.
 Note: If you are using a PC card reader, first insert the SD card into a PC card reader adapter (optional), and then insert the PC card adapter into the computer's PC card slot.
- 2. Double-click the icon of the drive with the SD card.
- 3. Copy images from the card into a folder of your choice on the hard disk.




Downloading Pictures with a USB Cable



Note for Win 98 SE users: You must install the camera driver bundled on the Digital Camera software installation CD-ROM before connecting the camera to the computer.

Connect the supplied USB interface cable to the computer's USB port and the camera's DIGITAL terminal.





- 1. You do not need to turn off the computer or camera when making this connection.
- 2. Please refer to your computer manual for information regarding the location of the USB port.

The LCD monitor turns off when the connection to the computer has been successfully completed.



- 1. The camera will turn off automatically if the USB cable is disconnected.
- 2. If this is the first time the camera has been connected to the computer, Windows detects the camera as an "Unknown device" and automatically completes the required software installation.

Downloading files

- 1. Double-click on My Computer.
- 2. For WINDOWS 98 SE/2000/ME; Double-click "Removable Disk".

For WINDOWS XP: Double-click "Internal".

- Double-click "DCIM".
- Double-click the folder that contains the desired files.
 - The file names of the pictures (JPG) and video clips (MPEG4) stored in the memory card will be displayed.
- 5. Drag or copy the files onto your computer.



Video clips may not be played by clicking directly on the video clip files, if your computer did not install Windows Media Player 9. To view the video clips, please install and launch the Ulead Photo Explorer or Ulead VideoStudio first.

UNDERSTANDING CAMERA MEMORY AND STORAGE

Internal Memory

The digital camera is equipped with internal memory. If an SD card is not installed in the camera, all photos recorded by the camera will be stored in the internal memory. If an SD card is installed, photos and video clips are stored on the SD card.

Optional SD Memory Card

Photos, video clips, and other information recorded by the camera are stored on the SD card using the Design Rule for Camera File System (DCF) protocol. The DCF protocol is designed to accommodate file and data exchange between digital cameras and other devices.

DCF Protocol

The DCF protocol defines the format for image file data as well as the directory for the memory card. Photos that are taken by a DCF camera can be viewed on DCF-compatible cameras from other manufacturers.

INSTALLING SOFTWARE

The functions of the software that were bundled with the supplied CD-ROM are listed as below:

Enable Win 98 SE users to download files from the camera to a
computer.
Enable Windows 98 SE/2000/ME/XP users to view the pictures
and or video clips recorded with the camera, and to edit or
manage pictures.

Note for Win 98 SE user: You must install the camera driver. Otherwise you will not able to download files from the camera to your computer.

Note for Win ME/XP users: If your computer does not have Windows Media Player 9 preinstalled and you do not want to install Ulead VideoStudio 7 SE or Ulead Photo Explorer 8.0 SE, you must install the Windows Media Format, otherwise you will not able to view the video clips recorded with this camera.

Note for Win 98 SE/2000 users: If your computer does not have Windows Media Player 9 preinstalled, you must install Ulead VideoStudio 7 SE or Ulead Photo Explorer 8.0 SE, otherwise you will not able to view the video clips recorded with this camera.

INSTALL THE SOFTWARE DRIVER - FOR WIN 98 SE USERS

You must install the camera software drivers if your operating system is Windows 98 SE. Once the USB driver is installed, you do not need to install the USB driver again.

Start up your computer, and insert the software installation CD-ROM into the CD-ROM drive.
 The model selection screen will appear in a few seconds. If it does not appear, double-click My

Computer and find the CD-ROM drive, then double-it.





Click **Drivers** on the model selection screen. Choose a language from the menu and click **OK**. The "InstallShield Wizard" screen appears.

Note: The computer may remind you to disconnect the camera with the computer and to prepare the system CD, please click **OK** to continue the installation.

3. Click Next.

The USB driver installation starts. When the installation is completed, the screen informs you of completion.

 Click "Yes, I want to restart my computer now" then click "Finish" Your computer restarts. Then, you can establish USB connection.
