PREPARING THE CAMERA

Installing the Battery

We highly recommend that you use the specified rechargeable lithium-ion battery to realize the full capability of your digital still camera. Make sure that the power of the digital still camera is off before inserting or removing the battery.

- 1. Open the battery/SD memory card cover.
- 2. Insert the battery in the correct orientation shown.
 - Tilt the battery lock lever in the direction of the arrow and orient the battery so that its label is facing to the rear side of the camera, and then insert the battery.
- 3. Close the battery/SD memory card cover.




To remove the battery

Open the battery/SD memory card cover and then release the battery lock lever. When the battery has come out a little, slowly pull it out the rest of the way.

Charging the Battery

The state-of-charge of the battery will affect the performance of the digital still camera. To maximize battery performance and lifetime, it is recommended that you fully charge the battery using the AC adapter/charger and then fully discharge it (through normal use) at least one time. Make sure that the power of the digital still camera is off and then insert the battery before starting.

- Insert the conversion adapter into the conversion adapter terminal of the camera as shown in the illustration.
- 2. Connect one end of the AC adapter/ charger to the DC IN terminal of the conversion adapter.
- Connect the other end of the AC adapter/charger to a wall outlet.
 - Charging time differs depending on the ambient temperature and the status of battery.





- The digital still camera must be used with the specified AC adapter/ charger. Damage caused by the use of an incorrect adapter is not covered under the warranty.
- Always make sure that the digital still camera is off before removing the battery.
 - The battery may feel warm after it has been charged or immediately after being used. This is normal and not a malfunction.
 - When using the digital still camera in cold environments, keep the digital still camera and its battery warm by holding it inside your jacket or other warm protective environment.

Using an AC Adapter/Charger

Using an AC adapter/charger prevents the digital still camera from automatically powering off while transferring files to your computer.



Formatting an SD Memory Card or Internal Memory

Formatting erases all images, videos, audio files and folders that are stored on the SD memory card or internal memory. Formatting is not possible if an SD memory card is locked.

- 1. Press the **POWER** button to turn on the camera.
- 2. Slide the mode switch to [\square] or [\square].
- 3. Press the ► button to select [SETUP].
- Use the ▲/▼/◀/▶ buttons to select [FORMAT], then press the OK button.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select [YES], then press the OK button to confirm.
 - To cancel formatting, select [NO].





- You should format an SD memory card with the camera before using it for the first time.
- To format the internal memory, do not insert a memory card into the camera. Otherwise, you will format the memory card.
- Formatting is an irreversible action and data cannot be recovered.
- An SD memory card with errors cannot be properly formatted.

Setting Image Resolution and Quality

Resolution and quality settings determine the file size and compression ratio for your images. These settings affect the number of images that can be stored in memory, or on a memory card.

High resolution and quality settings are recommended for printed output and situations requiring the finest detail. Lower resolution/quality images take up less memory space and are quite suitable for sharing images via e-mail, in a report, or on a web page.

To change image resolution or image quality:

- 1. Press the **POWER** button to turn on the camera.
- 2. Slide the mode switch to [\square].





Capturing Images

- 1. Press the **POWER** button to turn on the camera.
- 2. Slide the mode switch to [
- 3. Compose your image in the LCD monitor.
- 4. Press the shutter button down halfway, then press it down fully.
 - Pressing the shutter button down halfway automatically focuses and adjusts the exposure.
 - The focus-area frame turns blue when the camera is focused and the exposure is determined.
 - When the focus or exposure is not suitable, the frame of the focus area turns yellow.



- Pressing the IOI button changes the LCD display in the sequence of: Standard Display → Simplified Display → No Information.



Using the Optical Zoom

Zoom photography allows you to capture images magnified up to 3x or wideangle photography depending on the distance up to the subject. You can further enlarge the center of the screen and capture images using the digital zoom.

- 1. Slide the mode switch to [\square] or [\square].
- 2. Compose the image with the zoom button.
 - Pressing the T button zooms in on the subject, and enlarges the subject on the LCD monitor.
 - Pressing the W button provides a wider-angle image.



- The lens position moves according to the zoom button setting.
- 3. Press the shutter button down halfway to set the focus and exposure, then press it down fully to capture the image.



The zoom function cannot be used while a video clip is recording.

Using the Digital Zoom

Using a combination of 3x optical zoom and 4x digital zoom permits zoom photography up to 12x to suit the subject and the distance. Digital zoom is a compelling feature, however, the more an image is enlarged (zoomed), the more pixilated (grainer) the image will appear.

The flash is designed to function automatically when lighting conditions warrant its use. You can capture an image using a flash mode suitable to your circumstances.

- 1. Press the **POWER** button to turn on the camera.
- 2. Slide the mode switch to [\square].
- 3. Press the 🏠 button.
 - The screen of flash mode menu is displayed.
- Use the ◄/▶ buttons to select the desired flash mode, then press the OK button.
 - To cancel the selection and exit from the flash mode menu, press the ▲/▼ buttons.
 - The flash mode you set will be displayed on the LCD monitor.
- 5. Compose your scene and press the shutter button.

Using the Self-Timer

The self-timer can be set to [D] mode. This feature is useful for situations where you may wish to join the scene when taking group shots.

- 4. Toggle the ♂ button to select the desired self-timer mode.

Adjusting the Exposure

Images can be captured with the scene intentionally made brighter or darker. These settings are used when a suitable brightness (exposure) cannot otherwise be obtained in circumstances where the difference in brightness between the subject and the background (the contrast) is large, or when the subject that you wish to capture is very small within the scene. Exposure can be set in 0.3 EV units.

Quick Selection

- Slide the mode switch to [□] and press the ☑ button.

 Backlight Correction.
- Set the exposure value with the ▲/▼ buttons.

Setting the White Balance

The human eye adapts to changes in light so that white objects still appear white even when the light changes. With a digital camera, however, the color of the subject is influenced by the color of the light surrounding it. This color adjustment is called "white balance adjustment". This setting allows you to set the white balance when capturing images under specific lighting conditions.

- 1. Slide the mode switch to [
- Press the line button. The [PICTURE] menu appears.
- Use the ▲/▼/◀/► buttons to select [WHITE BALANCE], then press the OK button.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select the desired setting.
- 5. To exit from the menu, press the 🗉 button.



Continuous Capture

In continuous capture mode, you can capture a rapid sequence of images with one press of the shutter button. This function is very useful for photographing objects in motion where it is difficult to determine the precise moment of capture. Afterwards, you may review the sequence of images to select the best one.

- 1. Slide the mode switch to [🖸] .
- Press the ■ button, then use the button to select the [FUNCTION] menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select [CAPTURE MODE], then press the OK button.
- Use the ▲ /▼ buttons to select [CONTINUOUS ■], then press the OK button.
- To exit from the menu, press the solution.
 - The indicator is displayed on the monitor screen.





Auto-Exposure Bracketing (AEB)

Auto-exposure bracketing is an effective technique when it is difficult to determine the precise exposure of a scene. Using AEB the camera will capture a sequential burst of three images at three different exposure settings. Afterwards, you may review the sequence of images to select the best exposure.

- 1. Slide the mode switch to [\square].
- Press the ■ button, then use the
 buton to select the [FUNCTION] menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select [CAPTURE MODE], then press the OK button.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select [AEB
 I, then press the OK button.



Adjusting White Balance Manually

Manual white balance lets you configure the digital still camera for a particular light source and other conditions. Note that you must perform manual white balance under the same conditions you will be shooting. You must also have a piece of white paper or other similar object on hand in order to perform this function.

 button. The [PICTURE] menu appears.




PLAYBACK MODE - THE BASICS

In the playback mode, you can view, magnify, delete images, play video clips, or run a slide show. This mode also provides a thumbnail image display, allowing you to quickly search for the desired image.

Viewing Images

- 1. Press the **POWER** button to turn on the camera.
- 2. Slide the mode switch to [\blacktriangleright].
- Use the
 buttons to select the desired images.
 - To view the previous image, press the ◀ button.



- To view the next image, press the ▶ button.
- Pressing the ▲/▼ buttons during image playback rotate the image 90 degrees. The ▲ button rotates the image clockwise, whereas the ▼ button rotates the image counterclockwise.

 Pressing the |O| button while playing back images changes the LCD

Magnifying Images

While reviewing your images, you may enlarge a selected portion of an image. This magnification allows you to view the details. Images displayed can be enlarged in 8 times enlargement.

- 1. Slide the mode switch to [D].
- 2. Use the $\triangleleft/\triangleright$ buttons to select the desired images.
 - To view the previous image, press the ◀ button.
 - To view the next image, press the button.
- 3. Adjust the zoom ratio using the zoom button.
 - To enlarge the selected image, press the T button.
 - To return to normal magnification, press the W button.
 - The magnification factor is displayed on the LCD monitor.
- 4. To view different portion of the images, press the $A/\nabla/\langle A \rangle$ buttons to adjust the display area.





- You will see a white frame with a pink box inside. The white frame indicates the entire image, while the pink box shows the location of the currently enlarged area.
- 5. To return to regular display, toggle the **W** button until the regular display appears on the screen.



The range of magnification factor is: 1.5x, 2.0x, 2.5x, 3.0x, 3.5x, 4.0x, 4.5x, 5.0x, 5.5x, 6.0x, 6.5x, 7.0x, 7.5x and 8.0x.

Thumbnail Display (Index Playback)

This function allows you to view four or nine thumbnail images on the LCD monitor simultaneously so you may search for a particular image.

- 1. Slide the mode switch to [\blacktriangleright].
- Press the [[]∃ button to enter the [PLAY] menu. Select [THUMBNAIL] with the ▲/
 ▼/◄/ ► buttons, then press the OK button.
- Use the ▲/ ▼ buttons to choose the desired number of thumbnail images to be displayed, then press the OK button.
 - Press the 🗉 button to exit from [PLAY] menu.
- 4. Press the W button.
 - Four or nine thumbnail images are displayed simultaneously.
- Use the ▲/▼/◀/▶ buttons to select the image to be displayed at regular size, then press the OK button to display the selected image on full screen.

Slideshow Display

The slideshow function enables you to play back your images automatically in sequential order. This is very useful and entertaining feature for reviewing recorded images and for presentations.

- 1. Slide the mode switch to [🕨].
- Press the I button to enter the [PLAY] menu.
- Select [SLIDE SHOW] with the ▲/▼/◀/
 buttons, then press the OK button.
- Use the ▲ /▼ buttons to set the slideshow interval, then press the OK button.
 - The slide show starts.
 - Each video clip is presented by the first frame of the video clip.
 - To stop the slide show display, press the **OK** button.

Resizing an Image

You can change the image size of a captured image to one of the following: 2560 x 1920 pixels, 2048 x 1536 pixels, 1280 x 960 pixels and 640 x 480 pixels.

- Use the ◀ / ► buttons to select the desired image you want to resize.
- Press the
 button to enter [PLAY]



Playing Back Video Clips



Immediate Erasure (Quick Delete Function)

The quick delete function lets you delete the last image captured.






Setting the DPOF

DPOF (Digital Print Order Format) allows you to embed printing information on your memory card. Files saved in the DPOF format can be printed using compatible printers or through a laboratory printing device.



In order to do this, you must install the USB driver onto your computer first. Step 1: Installing the USB driver

Windows 98/98SE computers

The USB driver on the supplied CD-ROM is exclusively for Windows 98 and 98SE computers. Installing the USB driver on computers running Windows 2000/ME/XP is not necessary.

- 1. Insert the CD-ROM that came with the camera into your CD-ROM drive.
- When the welcome screen appears, click "INSTALL USB DRIVER". Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.
- 3. After the USB driver has been installed, restart your computer.




Macintosh OS 9.0 computers

For Mac OS 9.0 or higher, the computer will automatically recognize the digital still camera and load its own USB drivers.

Step 2: Connecting the digital still camera to your computer

- 1. Connect one end of the USB cable to the conversion adapter terminal of the camera.
 - If you use the conversion adapter to connect the USB cable, insert the conversion adapter into the conversion adapter terminal of the camera first, and then connect one end of the USB cable to the USB terminal of the conversion adapter.
- Connect the other end of the USB cable to an available USB port on your computer.
- 3. Turn on the camera.
 - The [USB] screen is displayed.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select [PC], then press the OK button.
- There will be a new "Removable Disk" icon detected in "My Computer", which contains your recorded images/video clips/audio files.

(For **Mac users**, double-click the [untitled] or [unlabeled] disk drive icon on our desktop.)





When connecting to the computer, you must use the battery or an AC power adapter.

Step 3: Downloading images, videos or voice files

When the digital still camera is turned on and connected to your computer, it is considered a disk drive, just like a floppy disk or a CD. You can download (transfer) images by copying them from the "Removable disk" ("untitled" or "unlabeled" disk on a Macintosh) to your computer hard drive.

Windows

Open the "removable disk" and double click on the DCIM / CAMERA folder to open it to find more folders. Your images are inside these folder(s). Select the desired still images / video clips /audio files and then choose "Copy" from the "Edit" menu. Open the destination location (folder) and choose "Paste" from the "Edit" menu. You may also drag and drop image files from the digital still camera to a desired location.

Macintosh

Open the "untitled" disk icon, and the destination location on your hard disk. Drag and drop from the digital still camera to the desired destination.





- A video playback application is not included with the package. Make sure that a video playback application has been installed in your computer.

CONNECTING TO A PICTBRIDGE Compliant printer

If a printer that supports PictBridge is available, images can be printed by connecting the digital still camera directly to the PictBridge-compatible printer without using a computer.

Connecting the camera to the printer

- Connect the USB port on the camera and the USB jack on the printer with the supplied USB cable, then turn on your camera and the printer.
 - The "USB" screen is displayed.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select [PRINTER], then press the OK button.



Printing images



 - [QUANTITY]: Specifies the number of prints. You can select up to 10.
 - [DATE]: If you select [WITH], images are printed with the date. [FILE NAME]: If you select [WITH], images
 - are printed with the file name.
 [EXIT]: To cancel the print settings, use the ▲/▼ buttons to select [EXIT].
- After configuring the print settings, you can still use the ◄/ ► buttons to change the image that you want to print. Then, press the OK button to print.
- Use the ▲/ ▼ buttons to select [PRINT], then press the OK button to confirm.
- The printing starts, and the message "TRANSFERRING" is displayed on the screen. The message disappears after the printing is finished.
- Pressing the OK button during print data transfer displays the screen for selecting whether to [CONTINUE] or [CANCEL] printing.





USING THE DIGITAL STILL CAMERA AS A PC CAMERA

Your digital still camera can act as a PC camera, which allows you to video conference with business associates, or have a real-time conversation with friends or family. To use the digital still camera for video conferencing, your computer system must include the items as below:

- Microphone
- Sound card
- Speakers or headphones
- Network or Internet connection



- Video conferencing (or video editing) software is not included with the digital still camera.
- This mode is not supported for Mac.

Step 1: Installing the PC camera driver

The PC-camera driver included in the CD-ROM is exclusively for Windows. The PC camera function is not supported for Mac platforms.

- 1. Insert the CD-ROM that came with the camera into your CD-ROM drive.
- When the welcome screen appears, click " DRIVER For PC CAM". Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.
- 3. After the driver installation is completed, restart your computer.



Step 2: Connecting the digital still camera to your computer

- 1. Connect one end of the USB cable to the conversion adapter terminal of the camera.
 - If you use the conversion adapter to connect the USB cable, insert the conversion adapter into the conversion adapter terminal of the camera first, and then connect one end of the USB cable to the USB terminal of the conversion adapter.



- 2. Connect the other end of the USB cable to an available USB port on your computer.
- 3. Turn on the camera.
 - [USB] screen is displayed.
- 4. Use the \blacktriangle/∇ buttons to select [PC CAM], then press the **OK** button.
- Position the digital still camera steadily on top of your computer monitor or use a tripod.



When using this digital still camera as a PC camera, you must use the battery or an AC power adapter.

Step 3: Running your application software (i.e. Windows NetMeeting)

To use Windows NetMeeting for videoconferencing:

- Go to Start → Programs → Accessories → Communications → NetMeeting to launch the NetMeeting program.
- 2. Click the Start Video button to view live video.
- 3. Click the Place Call button.
- 4. Type the e-mail address or the network address of the computer that you are calling.
- 5. Click **Call**. The person that you are calling must also have Windows NetMeeting running and be willing to accept your call to start the videoconference.



 The video resolution for video conferencing applications is generally 320 x 240.




