Cellphone Etiquette

Mind your manners!

A cellphone always emits weak radio waves while it is turned on. Enjoy operation of your cellphone without forgetting to be considerate of those around you.

Some locations do not allow the use of cellphones.

- Using a cellphone while driving is dangerous and prohibited by the Traffic Control Law.
- Using a cellphone inside of an aircraft is prohibited by law. Be sure to turn off your cellphone before takeoff.



Watch out where you use your cellphone, and keep your voice down.

- Do not make calls at cinemas, theaters, museums, libraries, or other similar locations. Turn off the cellphone or use Manner Mode to ensure that the ring tone does not disturb others.
- When in public, move to a location where you will not be blocking traffic.
- On the Shinkansen, in a hotel lobby, or in other similar locations, move to a location where you will not disturb others.
- Take care to avoid talking on the phone in a loud voice.
- Before taking the picture of others, be sure to obtain permissions first.



Cellphone radio waves may interfere with electrical medical equipment.

- On a train or in other crowded locations, there is always the possibility that someone nearby may be wearing a pacemaker. Turn off your cellphone when you are in a crowded area.
- Follow the rules of hospitals and other medical facilities prohibiting the use or possession of cellphones.





Manner Mode and Easy Voice Memo

Manner Mode

Use Manner Mode to turn off the ring tone so as not to bother others around you.




While the standby screen is displayed, hold down  for about one second.

Easy Voice Memo

If you cannot answer a call, Easy Voice Memo plays an answering message and records the caller's message.



While the standby screen is displayed, hold down  for about one second.

Checking Power, Signal Strength, and Battery Level

Normally leave the phone turned on.



The phone needs to be turned on to make and receive calls.


Hold down  for at least 1.5 seconds to turn on W52CA. After a while, W52CA turns on with tone and the standby screen appears.

You cannot talk on the phone if it is unable to receive a signal.



Signal strength is low in some areas, even if they are within the service area.

Keep an eye on the battery level.



Never use your cellphone while driving!

Holding a cellphone in your hand, talking on a cellphone, or looking at a cellphone display to send mail or to perform any other operation while driving is prohibited by Japanese law.
(Revised Traffic Control Law, effective November 1, 2004)





Drive Mode

In Drive Mode, the phone will play the message “ただいま車を運転しています。…” (I am driving right now...), and then ask the caller to leave a message using Easy Voice Memo.

While the standby screen is displayed, press , and then press  (ON). Next, press  (Drive Mode) to enter Drive Mode.




Beware of spam and One-ring Calls!

How to Combat Spam

You can set up mail filters to block specific mail or mail identified as “未承諾広告※” (unsolicited advertisement), which often includes spam.

The following are the main features your cellphone uses to block spam.


- Blocking of “未承諾広告※” (unsolicited advertisement) mail
- Blocking of specific mail
- Blocking of spoof mail



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Beware of One-ring Calls!

A “One-ring Call” (wan-giri in Japanese) rings your phone only once, in an attempt to make you call back to a service that automatically bills you very high charges.

If W52CA received a “One-ring Call,” the  icon appears at the head of an incoming record.

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Disaster Message Board Service

Disaster Message Board

The Disaster Message Board lets you use EZweb to register information about your well-being in case of a major disaster. The information you register can be accessed from anywhere in Japan over EZweb or the Internet.

Registering the safety information

- ◆ When a major disaster strikes, you can use your au cellphone to access the “災害用伝言板” (Disaster Message Board) on EZweb and register your current condition, comments, and other information about your well-being.
- ◆ After you register information, it can be sent by mail to family, friends, and other individuals you have registered as a recipient of your Disaster Message Board information.

Checking the safety information

- ◆ Disaster Message Board information can be accessed by inputting the phone number of an individual over EZweb or the Internet.*
 - ※ Disaster Message Board information can be accessed from another type of cellphone, PHS, or PC at <http://dengon.ezweb.ne.jp/>.





※1 During a call, do not cover the microphone with your hands or your chin. The microphone (placed on W52CA shown above) allows you to talk over your W52CA in Viewfinder position.

※2 Take care to avoid covering the built-in antenna with your hand when using the phone, using EZweb, and when accessing GPS information.

※Do not take out this card if not necessary as your number is recorded on it.

※ Extend the TV antenna when you watch EZ Television (1Seg).


Leaving the TV antenna extended while making a call or using EZweb will not affect reception quality.

Charging the Battery Pack

The battery pack that comes with the phone is not fully charged when you purchase it. Be sure to charge the battery pack before using the W52CA for the first time. Charging takes about 140 minutes.

You should recharge the battery pack whenever the battery level icon shows  or .

Check the shape of connectors before connecting, and ensure that you plug them in as far as they will go.



Aligning the locking tabs of the desktop holder with the slots on the sides of the phone, attach the phone to the holder in the sequence **2-1**, **2-2**.

You can also use the plug by extending the prongs like this.

CAUTION

- ◎ You must purchase a common AC adaptor 01 (option) for charging. Note that the configuration of the AC adaptor may be different from that shown in the illustration above.
- ◎ Connect and pull out the connector of the common AC adaptor 01 (option) to/from the W52CA or the connecting terminal of the desktop holder in the right direction.



1 Connect a common AC adaptor 01 (option) to the desktop holder.

Check the shape of the connectors to ensure they are aligned correctly before you connect.

Trying to force a connection may damage the connectors.

2 Insert the W52CA into the desktop holder.


3 Fold out the power plug of the common AC adaptor 01 (option), and then plug it into a 100V AC power outlet.

This will cause the W52CA charging indicator (LED) to light red, and  (charging battery icon) to display. When charging is completed, the battery level icon will show  and the charging indicator (LED) will go out.

When charging the battery with your W52CA in Viewfinder position, check the charging battery icon shown on the screen. If you set “Func in Charge” to “MEDIA STAND,” the screen keeps illuminating with the normal brightness.

To remove the W52CA from the desktop holder, holding the holder by hand and remove W52CA.


※ You can connect the common AC adaptor 01 (option) to the W52CA directly to charge the battery pack.



Check the shape of the connector ends to ensure they are aligned correctly (shown above) when connecting.

※ Using Extension Mode

Using the Extension Mode, W52CA automatically shuts down the radio wave after issuing the Low Battery Alert. This is quite a useful function that you can still check outgoing/incoming records, content of e-mail, address book, schedule and so on when necessary. In this case, you can only use the functions which needs no radio wave.

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■ Turning off power


Main Menu

Pressing  while the standby screen is displayed displays the main menu.
Use  to select the icon, and then press  (OK) to access the function associated with the icon.







Using the Main Menu

Example: To display the setting screen from the main menu.



Soft keys are the keys you use to execute the functions along with the bottom of the screen. The table below explains how to assign the soft keys to the on-screen functions. Note that the function of each soft key depends on the currently displayed screen.




Left soft key 	Executes the function on the left.
Center soft key 	Executes the function on the center.
Right soft key 	Executes the function on the right.

■ Using Menus

Pressing the soft key that corresponds to the “Menu” at the bottom of the display will display a menu of various operations related to the function you are currently using.

Example: To open the photo monitor menu screen from photo monitor screen.




Viewfinder Position and Self-portrait Position

You can execute the operations with your W52CA open, set in Viewfinder position or Self-portrait position.



CAUTION

- ◎ Rotate your W52CA display in the direction as illustrated below (within 180 degrees from the normal position). Gently rotate your W52CA display. Otherwise, you may damage your W52CA.
- ◎ During rotating (motion **2-1**), do not use your W52CA or force to give open-close motion. It may also cause damage.

1 Open your W52CA display to stand straight up.




2 Gently rotate the display 180 degrees clockwise.



■ When you set your W52CA in Viewfinder position

3 Close your W52CA so as to make your W52CA display facing toward you.




● Viewfinder position

Viewfinder position refers to the position with your W52CA closed and its display turned over. In Viewfinder position, you can use side keys (マナ, ◀, ▶, 0, □) to operate your W52CA.

You can also take photos using W52CA as a Viewfinder (digital camera-like).

■ When you set your W52CA in Self-portrait position

3 Turn over your W52CA so as to make camera lens facing toward you.



● Self-portrait position

You can take your self-portrait photo easily with this position.

Press **4**  in the photo monitor screen to toggle self-portrait feature on and off.

Basic Operations in Viewfinder Position

In Viewfinder position, you can use side keys (マナー, ◀▶, ◎, □) to play songs listed with au Music Player and read the data.

For key operations in Viewfinder position, you can use ◀▶ instead of

⬆ or use ◎ instead of ●.

マナー returns to the previous screen.


Info

- ◎ In Viewfinder position, you can only execute the operations using side keys. When needed, you can execute other operations with your cellphone open.
- ◎ You can make or answer a call in Viewfinder position.
- ◎ During a call in Viewfinder position, check the earpiece position to hear the caller's voice properly. During a call or recording a call, the image you see on the screen is upside down.
- ◎ During a call, it is recommended to use your cellphone opened.
- ◎ In this manual, operation procedures are usually for the normal position (with display facing inward toward the keypad). For operations in Viewfinder or self-portrait position (with display facing outward), the position you can use is clearly mentioned.

Using the Main Menu (Viewfinder)






Initializing E-mail and EZweb

One-ring Calls

What is a “One-ring Call”?

A “One-ring Call” is an incoming call that rings your phone only once, which aims it to be stored in your incoming records. If you redial the number shown in your incoming records, often you are connected to a dating service or some other service that may bills you very high charges. Always keep in mind that it is a good idea to avoid calling back unfamiliar numbers.

Do not cover the lens or optical sensor with your hands. Hold the camera securely with both hands. Use the index finger of your right hand to press  to release the shutter.



Tips for Avoiding Hand Movement

- Remain steady by keeping your arms lightly against your sides and standing with your feet about shoulder width apart. Having your arms away from your side or extended in front of you can cause blurred images.
- When you press the shutter button, remain still until your shutter tone finishes sounding. This is especially important when shooting where lighting is dim.
- A self-timer is also provided for shooting photos. With the self-timer, you do not need to press the shutter button to shoot a photo, so there is less chance of a blurred image caused by accidental movement of the phone.

Auto focus

W52CA has built-in auto focus function. You can shot photos with the subject properly focused simply by pressing the shutter key.

Touch Message

Use FeliCa to send and receive address book information, profiles, images, and other data.



If you lose your W52CA

Configuring “Lock by Incoming” settings for Remote Ctrl Lock makes it possible to perform a remote operation that activates Auto Lock and FeliCa lock to lock the W52CA. This helps to avoid unauthorized use of your phone and its features.

■ Configuring Operating Environment Settings for Lock by Incoming

Repeatedly calling the W52CA from a pre-registered telephone number a specified number of times within a specified amount of time will activate Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock.

- 1 While the standby screen is displayed, press **●** **4** た GHI **1** あ .@ **3** さ DEF, input the lock No., and then press **●** (OK).



- 2 Press **3** さ DEF (Lock by Incoming) and then press **4** た GHI (Caller ID List).



- 3 Use **↑** to select a registration number, press **アプリ** (Edit), input the phone number, and then press **●** (Reg).



You can also press **☰** (Menu) before inputting a phone number, and select the number from the address book, outgoing records, or incoming records, or you can specify a pay phone. You can register up to three different phone numbers.

Press **メモ/クリア** twice and advance to the next step.

- 4 Press **1** あ .@ (ON/OFF Setup), and then press **1** あ .@ (ON).



- 5 Press **2** か ABC (Specified Time), input the period you want to specify, and then press **●** (OK).



You can set the time period (the time intervals from the first call to the last call you should make to activate Remote Ctrl Lock).

You can set the time period between 1 to 10 minutes.

Press **3 DEF** (Num of Incoming), input the number of calls you want to specify, and then press **OK**.

You can set how many times you should repeat making a call to activate Remote Ctrl Lock.
You can set it from 3 to 10 calls.



■ Using Remote Operation to Lock the W52CA with Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock

After using the procedure under “Configuring Operating Environment Settings for Lock by Incoming” (page 98) to register the calling phone number, place the specified number of consecutive calls from the registered phone number to the W52CA within the specified amount of time.

You will hear the announcement “遠隔ロックを設定しました” (Remote Ctrl Lock activated), and the W52CA will be locked using Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock. Activation of Remote Ctrl Lock will cause your W52CA to turn off and then back on again automatically.

8 CAUTION

- ◎ Remote Ctrl Lock cannot be activated if the W52CA is not turned on or if it is outside its service area, or when “Emission OFF” is selected for “Emission OFF Mode (M57).” Also, you may not be able to activate Remote Ctrl Lock while the W52CA is in an area when the signal is weak.
- ◎ The initial default setting for the “Rel Phone Lock” of “Remote Ctrl Lock (M413)” is “Invalid.” When “Invalid” is selected, the unlock screen is not displayed while Remote Ctrl Lock is activated, and Remote Ctrl Lock cannot be unlocked using a W52CA operation. When “Valid” is selected, pressing any key while Remote Ctrl Lock is activated displays an unlock screen. Entering the proper lock number will deactivate Remote Ctrl Lock and unlock the phone.
- ◎ The initial default setting for the “Erase Data” of “Remote Ctrl Lock (M413)” is “OFF.” When “ON” is selected, activating Remote Ctrl Lock will perform “Memory Reset (M462)” and delete all data in the phone memory.


■ Using the Security Lock Service to Activate Remote Ctrl Lock

With the Security Lock Service, you can activate Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock remotely by placing a call to an au Customer Service Center or with your computer even if your phone is not configured for Lock by Incoming. The Security Lock Service is free.

Using the Security Lock Service

● Calling an au Customer Service Center to Activate or Deactivate Remote Ctrl Lock

On an au phone, dial 113 (free).

From another type of cellphone or a standard phone, dial the following toll-free number:  0077-7-113 (free).

- This service is available 24 hours per day.
- From the voice response menu, select “⑤ Using the Security Lock Service,” and then proceed in accordance with the voice guidance that is played.

● Using a Computer to Activate or Deactivate Remote Ctrl Lock

On the Internet, go to MyKDDI (<http://my.kddi.com/>) and log in, and then follow the instructions that appear on the screen.
