## **Cellphone Etiquette**

## Mind your manners!

A cellphone always emits weak radio waves while it is turned on. Enjoy operation of your cellphone without forgetting to be considerate of those around you.

#### Some locations do not allow the use of cellphones.

- Using a cellphone while driving is dangerous and prohibited by Traffic Control Law.
- Using a cellphone in an aircraft is prohibited by law. Be sure to turn off your cellphone.



## Watch out where you use your cellphone, and keep your voice down.

- Do not make calls at cinemas, theaters, museums, libraries, or other similar locations. Turn the cellphone off or use Manner Mode to ensure that the ring tone does not disturb others.
- When in public, move to a location where you will not be blocking traffic.
- On the Shinkansen, in a hotel lobby, or in other similar locations, move to a location where you will not disturb others.
- Take care to avoid talking on the phone in a loud voice.
- Before taking the picture of others, be sure to obtain permissions first.

## Cellphone radio waves may interfere with electrical medical equipment.

- On a train or in other crowded locations, there is always the possibility that someone nearby may be wearing a pacemaker. Turn your cellphone off when you are in a crowded area.
- Follow the rules of hospitals and other medical facilities prohibiting the use or possession of cellphones.

## Manner Mode and Easy Voice Memo

## **Manner Mode**

Use Manner Mode to turn off the ring tone so as not to bother others around you.



While the standby screen is displayed, hold down ▶ マナー for about one second. page 34

## **Easy Voice Memo**

If you cannot answer a call, Easy Voice Memo plays an answering message and records the caller's message.



While the standby screen is displayed. hold down Figure for about one second.

## **Checking Power, Signal** Strength, and Battery Level


## Normally leave the phone turned on.



The phone needs to be turned on to make and receive calls.

Hold down for at least 1.5 seconds to turn on W52P. After a while, W52P turns on with tone and the standby screen appears. page 15

## You cannot talk on the phone if it is unable to receive a signal.



Signal strength is low in some areas, even if they are within the service area.

indicates the current signal strength.

## Keep an eye on the battery level.



The phone may not function properly if battery power is low.

indicates the current battery level. page 15

## Never use your cellphone while driving!

Holding a cellphone in your hand, talking on a cellphone, or looking at a cellphone display to send mail or to perform any other operation while driving is prohibited by Japanese law. (Revised Traffic Control Law, effective November 1, 2004)



× Reading mail or looking at the display.



X Holding a cellphone in your hand to talk.

Turn off your cellphone or use Drive Mode while driving.

## **Drive Mode**

In Drive Mode, the phone will play the message "ただいま車を運転しています。・・" (I am driving right now...), and ask the caller to leave a message using Easy Voice Memo.



## Beware of spam and one-ring calls!

## **How to Combat Spam**

You can set up mail filters to block specific mail or mail identified as "未承諾広告※" (Unsolicited advertisement), which often includes spam.

Your cellphone has the following filters to block spam.

- ·blocks mail identified as "未承諾広告※" (Unsolicited advertisement)
- ·blocks specific mail
- ·blocks spoof e-mail

## **Beware of one-ring calls!**

A "one-ring call" (wan-giri in Japanese) rings your phone only once, in an attempt to make you call back to a service that automatically bills you very high charges.

The icon at the head of an incoming record indicates that the call



rang for only four seconds or less.

This indicates a possible "one-ring call".

## **Disaster Message Board**

The Disaster Message Board lets you use EZweb to register information about your well-being in case of a major disaster. The information you register can be accessed from anywhere in Japan over EZweb or the Internet.

Registering the safety information

- ◆ When a major disaster strikes, you can use your au cellphone to access the "災害用伝言板" (Disaster Message Board) on EZweb and register your current condition, comments, and other information about your well-being.
- After you register information, it can be sent by mail to family, friends, and other individuals you have registered as a recipient of your Disaster Message Board information.

# Opening W52P by Using a Single Key (One-push Open)

You can open the W52P easily by pressing the key. You can also open it manually without using the key.

Press the One-push open key.




#### Info

- O Your W52P might not open fully, depending on its direction.
- © Be careful not to drop it by its rebound when opening your W52P by pressing the key.
- Be careful not to catch your fingers when opening your W52P.
- O You need to close your W52P manually. If it does not close, once open it fully and close it.

## **Charging the Battery**

The battery pack that comes with the phone is not fully charged when purchased. Be sure to charge the battery pack before using the W52P for the first time. Charging takes about 140 minutes.

You should recharge the battery pack whenever the battery level icon shows



## Caution!

- You must purchase a common AC adaptor 01 (option) for charging. Note that the configuration of the AC adaptor may be different from that shown in the illustration above.
- Pull out the connector of the common AC adaptor 01 (option) straight so as to be parallel to the W52P or the desktop holder connector terminal when you connect them.
- Connect the common AC adaptor 01 (option) to the desktop holder.

Check the shape of the connectors to ensure they are aligned correctly before you connect.

Trying to force a connection may damage the connectors.

- Fold out the power plug of the common AC adaptor 01 (option), and plug it into a 100V AC power outlet.
- Insert the W52P into the desktop holder.



To remove the W52P from the desktop holder, holding the holder by hand and remove W52P.


You can connect the common AC adaptor 01 (option) to the W52P directly to charge the battery pack.



## How to attach the +Panel™

You can attach the +Panel to the W52P if you choose to do so. You can also have fun with the +Panels by replacing one with another to suit the setting or mood you find yourself in.





Remove the four short screws.

Do not lose or misplace the screws you have removed.

Use the four exclusive long screws to attach the +Panel.

Neatly align the +Panel with the sub display, and tighten the screws in ascending numerical order (1) to 4).

## **Caution!**


- Use the exclusive screwdriver provided to attach or detach the +Panel.
- Take care not to allow dirt or foreign matter to gain entrance between the +Panel and W52P.
  - You can effectively ensure that this will not happen by adhering the dust guard cushion in place around the circumference of the sub display before attaching the +Panel.
- Keep the exclusive screwdriver in a safe place. You can use it to attach other +Panels, available as optional accessories.

Hold down for at least 1.5 seconds.

## Using Soft Keys

Soft keys are the keys you use to execute the functions along with the bottom of the screen. The table below explains how to assign the soft keys to the on-screen functions. Note that the function of each soft key depends on the currently displayed screen.



| Left soft key   | Executes the function on the left.   |
|-----------------|--------------------------------------|
| Center soft key | Executes the function on the center. |
| Right soft key  | Executes the function on the right.  |

## Using Menus

Pressing the soft key that corresponds to the "Menu" at the bottom of the display will display a menu of various operations related to the function you are currently using.

## Initializing E-mail and EZweb

An EZweb subscription is required to use e-mail and EZweb. If you did not subscribe when you purchased your phone, contact your nearest au shop or the au Customer Service Center.

- You will be assigned an e-mail address automatically when you perform the EZweb initialization procedure.





#### **Display for Incoming Calls**



-If the caller's name is in your address book, it appears on the display. If not, only the caller's phone number is displayed.

A message appears when the phone number of the caller is not provided for some reason.

ID Unsent : The caller's phone refused to send its phone number.

Pay Phone : The call is from a pay phone.

Not Support : The call is from a phone that does not

support caller ID.

#### **Missed Call Notification**



- -The message " Call X" appears on the display if you did not answer one or more calls. Press (OK) to check incoming records (caller phone number, etc.).

## Redialing (Outgoing Records/ Incoming Records)



While the standby screen is displayed, press .



- : Displays outgoing records.
- : Displays incoming records.



Use to select the record whose number you want to dial, and press .



#### Info

The phone stores up to 50 records each for the outgoing records and incoming records. When a record is created while there are already 50 in memory, the oldest is deleted automatically to make room for the new one.

## **One-ring Calls**

■ What is a "one-ring call"?

A "one-ring call" is an incoming call that rings your phone only once, which aims it to be stored in your incoming records. If you redial the number shown in your incoming records, often you are connected to a dating service or some other service that may bills you very high charges. Always keep in mind that it is not a good idea to call back unfamiliar numbers.

■ One-ring call indicator



The icon indicates an incoming call you did not answer. The icon indicates an incoming call that rang for four seconds or less, which may be one-ring call with high possibility.






## **Turning On Manner Mode**

While Manner Mode is on, the phone alerts you to incoming calls by vibrating.



While the standby screen is displayed, hold down

▶ ▽+- for about one second.







Turning on Manner Mode also turns on Easy Voice Memo, which is indicated by on the display.

While Manner Mode is on, the phone vibrates without sounding its ring tone.

To turn off Manner Mode, hold down ▶ ¬¬+ for about one second.

## **Turning On Easy Voice Memo**



While the standby screen is displayed, hold down for about one second.



When Easy Voice Memo is on, the <a> icon</a> appears on the display.

W52P can store up to 4 Easy Voice Memos, each of which can contain up to 20 seconds recording time.

If a new Easy Voice Memo is recorded when there are already four in the memory, the oldest, unprotected, and has already been played back is deleted automatically to make room for the new one. Protected Easy Voice Memos are not deleted.

To turn off Easy Voice Memo, hold down for about one second.

#### Info

#### Using the Voice Mail

The Voice Mail allows callers, who could not reach you to leave voice messages, when the phone is turned off, or when you are not in a location within the range of the service with adequate signal strength.

EZ Navi uses global positioning system (GPS) information to provide you with useful information.



#### Checking your route: "EZ助手席ナビ" (Passenger seat Navi)



This service provides route information (by voice and map) to a person in passenger's seat.

#### When you check where your child is: "安心ナビ" (Safety Navi)



"Safety Navi" apps is composed of following three functions:

- "いつでも位置確認" (Auto Position Search) (paid)

You can check the location of an au cellphone supporting "Position Search" by operating W52P.

#### Info

- When you use EZ Navi for the first time, perform the EZweb initialization procedure. If you have not performed initialization yet, refer to "Initializing E-mail and EZweb" (page 23).
- You will be charged packet transmission fee when you use various EZ Navi services. With some services, separate information fee may also be charged.
- The display layout and contents are examples. These are subject to change.
- Safety Navi services are available only among the cellphones supporting these feature.
- © Before you can use Safety Navi, each other's cellphone number must be recorded in the address books of both of the cellphone.

Simple Mode lets you limit operations to the telephone function, address book, camera, e-mail, C-mail, EZweb, and other frequently used functions.







# Teens Mode

You can use au Music Player to enjoy a Chaku-Uta-Full® or your favorite CD tracks. Also, you can download a Chaku-Uta-Full® or purchase CD tracks by accessing "EZ Music!".

#### **Barcode Reader & Maker**

You can use the camera to read QR codes and barcodes. Also, you can create your own barcodes directly from your address book entries.

#### au My Page

You can upload and backup various data in your W52P (in Address Book, E-mail, Data Folder) to au My Page on server to manage/check them.

#### Infrared communication

You can exchange the data saved in your address book, Schedule, or Data Folder between au cellphones supporting infrared communication.

#### **EZ FeliCa**

Simply by holding W52P over reader/ writer (external device), you can use W52P for shopping by using e-money or credit card or use it as member's cards, point cards, a discount coupon, and so on.

#### EZ•FM

The W52P allows you to listen to the FM radio.

Matsushita round-type earphone jack conversion adaptor 01 and MDR-E0931SP/BC by SONY have a built-in antenna to get a signal.

#### EZ apps (BREW®)

Enjoy downloaded games and other software.

#### **PC Site Viewer**

#### Macro Mode (Photo and Movie)

## If you lose your W52P

Turning on Remote Auto Lock makes it possible for you to set Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock on from a remote location. These lock function keeps others from using your W52P.



#### Configuring Remote Auto Lock Settings

You can set Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock on by making calls several times from the registered phone number to your W52P within the specified period of time.





Press (Caller ID List).





Use to select a registration number, press (Edit), input the phone number, and press (Reg).





You can also press [\_\_\_] (Menu) before inputting a phone number, and select the number from the address book, outgoing records, or incoming records, or you can specify a pay phone. You can register up to three different phone numbers.

Press | twice and advance to the next step.

Press [1.8] (ON/OFF Setup), and press [1.8] (ON).





Press [2,3] (Specified Time), input the period you want to specify, and press • (OK).

You can set the time period (the time intervals from the first call to the last call you should make to activate Remote



Press 3 to (Num of Incoming), input the number

Incoming), input the number of calls you want to specify, and press • (OK).

You can set how many times you should repeat making a call to activate Remote Auto Lock. You can set it from 3 to 10 calls.





#### Setting Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock on

Make a call to your W52P from the registered phone number within the period of time which has been specified in "Configuring Remote Auto Lock Settings" (page 90).

Auto Lock). You can set the time period between 1 to 10 minutes.

After repeating a call (3 to 10 calls you have specified), Remote Auto Lock turns active, and you hear an announcement letting you know Auto Lock and FeliCa Lock has been set. After Remote Auto Lock turns active, your W52P is automatically turned off, and turned on again.

- Remote Auto Lock cannot be activated while your W52P is turned off or outside of the service area.
